'KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE, IMPACT AND PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT'

The British School at Athens is delighted to invite PG students and professionals to attend a new BSA course that offers the opportunity to explore and gain hands on experience of communicating archaeology to a wide audience.



This one-week residential course will draw on experts from the British School at Athens and collaborators in the Benaki, Agora, Canellopoulos Museum and will use on site teaching and tasks to highlight inclusivity and best practice in communicating archaeology. In addition to lectures and seminars led by the course Directors Rebecca Sweetman (Director of the BSA), and Tulsi Parikh (A.G. Leventis Fellow in Hellenic Studies), participants will meet with writers, journalists and museum professionals, podcaster & graphic artists to discuss their process in communicating archaeology.

The fee is £625, and the course limited to 12 places. A number of BSA-administered full and partial bursaries are available for students, which will be assigned on the basis of merit and need.
